

# Learning from Life Saving Rule events

The following is a short summary of a Life Saving Rule event, investigation, follow up, and learning opportunities.

It is intended to help share information and learn from each event to prevent future occurrences. It is about Saving Lives.

## Event Date & Description:

12/14/2010 --- Contract worker smoking outside of designated smoking area.

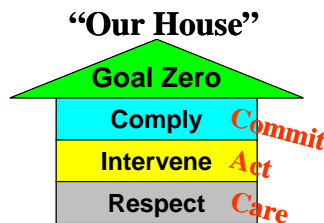
<b><u>What happened?</u></b> During routine housekeeping, the PIC was notified that there was the smell of cigarette smoke in the middle bedroom of the 12 man quarters building.
<b><u>Which Life Saving Rule(s) involved:</u></b> Do not smoke outside designated smoking area.
<b><u>Investigation results:</u></b> The PIC went to the quarters building to investigate and confirmed a strong smoke odor in the quarters' bathroom. He questioned the worker still in the building who admitted he had been smoking in the bathroom. The worker was aware and understood the Life Saving Rules and the consequences.
<b><u>Action taken:</u></b> The contract company representative was notified of the incident and the worker was removed from the location and will not be allowed to work on a Shell location.
<b><u>Key Learning Points:</u></b> 1) Smoke only in designated areas 2) If you choose to break the rules, you choose not to work for Shell

It is about saving lives, and it is working.

Everyone should ensure that we know the rules, follow the rules, and always intervene if there is the potential for unsafe behaviors or conditions. This applies to everyone: peers, supervisors, and visitors.

If in doubt, always consult your supervisor.
